FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

Based on the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, the variance is granted.

Facts, which support the request for relief from the strict terms of the Ordinance, in this case, a reduction of the minimum setback of 100 Ft. to 35 Ft. for the construction of a hay shed, are as follows:

The Applicants contracted with Stambaugh Pole Buildings to construct a hay shed. The contractor signed a statement that he would be responsible for building the shed in compliance with the County's codes. It was only after the construction of this shed did the Applicant's learn that a variance was needed. As a result, the Applicants are applying for the required variance. Undue hardship and practical difficulty would be imposed on the Applicants if they need to have the existing hay storage structure relocated.

Neighbors were present at the hearing supporting the Applicant's request; therefore, the granting of this variance should have no adverse effect on any adjoining property owners.

This approval is valid for one year from the date of a Zoning Certificate.
