## FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

The application, testimony and evidence comprising the record of this case are hereby included by reference in this decision. Based on the record, the Board hereby approves the conditional use and variance as requested. The pertinent findings determining the Board's decision include the facts that the lot, which was previously improved with a dwelling classified as a nonconforming use in the "I-G" General Industrial District, is completely surrounded by other properties owned by the applicant; the plan to enlarge the area of pit 1 for the extraction of limestone from the property is reasonable and appropriate, and to do otherwise would represent unnecessary hardship and practical difficulty in operation of the quarry; although the property lines could be eliminated by preparation of a new deed incorporating the area of the lot with adjoining property, to do so would be of no benefit other than to eliminate the technicality imposed by the provisions of the zoning ordinance in this case; and, there is no indication that authorization of the conditional use and waiver of the setback requirements will unduly affect adjacent properties of the quarry or public interests.
