FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

The application, testimony and evidence comprising the record of this case are hereby included by reference in this decision. Based on the record, the Board approved the conditional use and variances to allow use of the property and detached accessory building as presently existing. The pertinent findings determining the Board's decision include the facts that the proposed cottage industry is a graphic arts studio operated by Ms. Holliday with one employee. The studio will comply with the definition of a cottage industry expressed in Article 20 and the provisions of Sections 6.3(ff) of the zoning ordinance. The residence will continue to be the principal use of the property and operation of the studio within the detached accessory building will not adversely affect neighbors living or working nearby, values of adjacent properties, or public interests. Accordingly, the Board is convinced that authorization of the graphic arts studio as a conditional use and the necessary variances are justified, and are consistent with the intent and purpose of the provisions of the zoning ordinance.
