FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

On August 30, 2005, the Board of Zoning Appeals (the Board) convened to hear a conditional use request for a temporary retail use for the display and sale of hot tubs and spas (September 8 – September 26, 2005). The Board made the following findings and conclusion:

The Applicants are requesting conditional use approval for a sale of hot tubs and accessories during the referenced 2 week period. There will be a 60' x 80' tent erected for the sale, and hot tubs will be displayed. There will be 3 employees on site, and the sale will run 7 days a week, 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The sale is expected to attract 40-50 customers per day on weekends and 18-20 during the week. The sale will be confined to the portion of the property delineated on the document submitted to the Board as Exhibit 1.

The Board finds that this temporary use at this location will not generate adverse effects above and beyond those normally associated with such a use. Accordingly, the conditional use is granted, subject to the following:
