**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS**

Based on the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, the variance is granted.

Facts, which support the request for relief from the strict terms of the Ordinance, in this case, a reduction of the required 20 foot wide service roads to 12 feet are as follows:

These service roads will access parking spaces for a proposed expansion of the existing antenna farm. This is a 24 hour, seven days a week operation. The traffic on these roads is typically not two ways as most traffic will be coming and leaving on the same shifts or coming in for maintenance on the antennas and equipment. These service roads are within a fenced compound and are not roads that will be used by the public. As an environmental issue, when the amount of impervious area is reduced, it reduces the amount of storm water run-off.

No neighbors were present at the hearing opposing the Applicant's request; therefore, the granting of this variance should have no adverse effect on any adjoining property owners.

This approval is valid for one year from the date of this decision.
