FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

Based on the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing the home occupation is granted.

Facts which support the request for relief from the strict terms of the Ordinance; in this case, a home occupation for a laser engraving business, are as follows:

Mr. Kulp would like to start a laser engraving business in his basement. He would be engraving plaques, awards and other items. There will be no customers coming to his home. He plans on selling his items at shows and fairs. There will be no employees and no customers coming to his property.

No neighbors were present at the hearing opposing the home occupation; therefore, the granting of this home occupation should have no adverse effect on any adjoining property owners.

This approval is valid for one year from the date of this decision.
