FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

Based on the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, the variance is granted.

Facts, which support the request for relief from the strict terms of the Ordinance, in this case, a reduction of the minimum required setback from 20 feet to 11 feet to construct a detached garage; are as follows:

The Applicant is proposing to construct a detached garage to the right of the existing residence. The garage could not be constructed on left, rear or front of the property due to the existing well, septic and utility systems. As a result, construction of a garage on any other location of the Applicants' property would create unreasonable and practical difficulty.

There were no neighbors present at the hearing opposing the applicant's request; therefore, the granting of this variance should have no adverse effect on any adjoining property owners.

This approval is valid for one year from the date of this Zoning Certificate.
