## FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

Based on the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, the variance is granted.

Facts, which support the request for relief from the strict terms of the Ordinance, in this case, a reduction from the minimum required setback of 40 feet to 22 feet for the placement of a sign, are as follows:

An existing house was converted into a business building approximately six years ago. McCormick Engineering Company currently leases this location. A sign was erected on the property that does not meet the zoning ordinance requirements. The Applicant is requesting a variance on the sign location, because if the strict ordinance of the law has to be met for 40 feet, the sign would have to be placed on the inside of the building. The sign will not obstruct site distance.

Since there are no safety issues and the test of practical difficulty has been met, the reduction of the minimum required setback of 40 feet to 22 feet has been granted as presented.

This approval is valid for one year from the date of a Zoning Certificate.
