HEARING HELD:

FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

Based on the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, the variance is granted.

The Applicant obtained the necessary permits for footers and a slab to construct covered porches on the front, side and back of the house. To the back of the house, the Applicant started to construct walls, which turned that section of the covered porch project into an enclosed room.

The house is situated 52 Ft. from the setback, which is a restriction for the Applicant. The well is located in the front of the house, which only allowed for construction of the house to the rear of the property. There is also a severe drop on the side of the house. As a result, construction of this addition on any other location of the Applicant's property would create unreasonable and practical difficulty.

A neighbor was present at the hearing supporting the Applicant's request; therefore, the granting of this variance should have no adverse effect on any adjoining property owners.

This approval is valid for one year from the date of a Zoning Certificate.
