## **FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION**

On September 26, 2012, the Board of Zoning Appeals (the Board) convened to hear the request for a variance from the required setback of 10 ft. to 1 ft. for a storage shed. Based on the testimony and evidence presented, the Board made the following findings and conclusion:

Richard Sobchak is the owner of a property in the Edgewood Community Association in Eldersburg, Maryland. His backyard includes a pool and a fence. He would like to construct a shed, which would need a variance in the requested location. The Edgewood Community Association has approved the location of the shed. The 8 foot by 14 foot shed would be functional. There are limited places in his rear yard that the shed could be placed due to the pool, the fence, and grading issues. The literal enforcement of the zoning ordinance regarding the placement of his shed would create a hardship for Mr. Sobchak.

Accordingly, the Board is convinced that authorization of the request is consistent with the purpose of the zoning ordinance, appropriate in light of the factors to be considered with regard to variances and will not unduly affect the residents of adjacent properties, the values of those properties, or public interests.
